~ Grandmother and Jessica were watching Arachnophobia, and every time a spider appeared on the TV they jumped up and ran around the dining room table screaming. Jessica said it took about 3 or 4 hours to watch the entire movie!

~ She was always trying to think of a plan to make us all rich so we could buy houses at the beach and all move down there together. Emily's favorite was when she called a family meeting to discuss the development of a new board game. She was convinced as many games as we played surely we could put our heads together and come up with something good enough to make us millions! She gave us all jobs and Emily's was to take notes so we could stay organized. Needless to say, we didn't develop a board game and become millionaires. Emily also loved it when Grandmother dyed her grey hair back to her original black and it turned purple instead. Pretty funny considering her years as a hair stylist!
