“ I worked with Stanley at Clarage since 2008. It was only as I was trying to write down some words for today that I realized I'd known him for a quarter of my life. There aren't a lot of people I remember my first encounter with but I remember meeting Stanley very clearly. It was my first day and Clarage was in the process of moving from Birmingham to Pulaski. There wasn't a lot to do that day so my boss at the time told me I could leave around 2. There was a lot of packing going on so I decided to stay and help with boxes. Stanley was one of the people around that day and we started chatting. About an hour into moving boxes, he looked at me and said “you should go home. You've done more than enough”. And then the part that sticks out to me is one of those classic Southern sayings he would pull out from time to time. “We don't want to wear a good horse out”. I can't remember a time in my life I had ever been referred to as a horse (good or otherwise) but I found it instantly charming and endearing.

The next phase of our professional relationship came when he joined the engineering team. To this day, I find it incredible that he was able to pull this off. He went from a lifetime in manufacturing to a career in the engineering department when he in his 60's. He picked things up at a rapid pace and a few months into it, he was actually showing ME how to navigate around in 3D drawing software. It speaks to his work ethic that he became such a crucial part of our team in such short time while learning such a completely new skill.

Stanley was never just a co-worker to me. I don't think anyone in our team would ever use the word “co-worker” to describe him. He was “Stanley” or “Stan” or “Uncle Stanley” to some of the more good-natured amongst us. It's extremely rare for one person to be thought of universally as one thing to all people. I can stand here today and say he was universally loved (even on his grumpiest day). He was the kind of person who would offer kind words to a snot-nosed kid starting his first day on the job. He was the kind of person who would offer to help move some stuff for that same kid

when he was relocating to Pulaski. He was the kind of person who 8-years later would offer to move some of that stuff back to Birmingham. To Diane, Sherri, Cindy and everyone else in his family...thank you for sharing him with us for as long as you did. We missed him when he stopped working with us. We miss him even more today. And we will continue to miss this wonderful man who was a friend to each and every one of us.

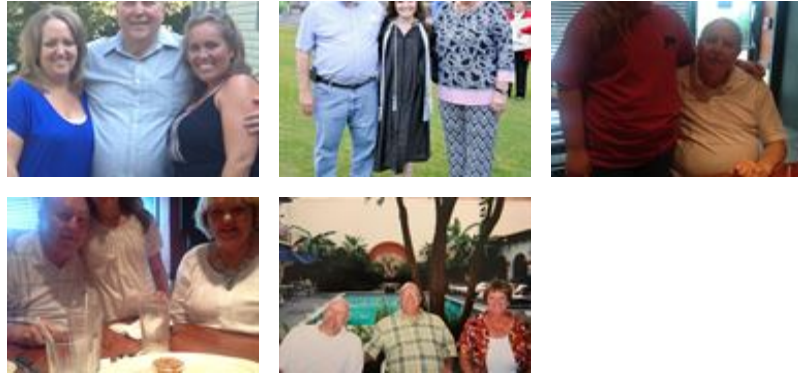
