“ I can't think of Terry without remembering the night he rescued me from the floor at Big Mama and Papa Woodward's. My sister Diane and I had gone to spend the night at Terry's family's house - he was still a teenager living at home with his mom (Aunt Frances) and sisters Kathy and Millie. Older brother Elvin was in the service then, I think. Anyway, Diane and I were spending the night with Millie, but since they didn't have a TV, we trooped down to Big Mama and Papa's to watch the Miss America Pageant after Big Mama and Papa went to bed - nobody locked doors back then. I was really small - maybe 5 or 6 - and fell asleep in the floor before the pageant ended. When it was over, Millie and Diane left me there on the cold hardwood floor and went to Millie's and went to bed. When Terry came in from his date, he did a bed check and didn't see me, so he shook Millie and Diane awake and asked where I was. Next thing I remember, I'm in Terry's arms and he's carrying up the hill to their house, where he plops me in the bed between Diane and Millie and saves me from freezing to death in Big Mama and Papa's floor. Terry was always so sweet and kind to everyone.
